In November 1999 a small boy called Elian Gonzalez and his mother left Cuba for the USA. It was a dangerous and illegal journey¹. They were in a group of 14 people in a small boat and 11 died. Elian survived², but his mother did not.

But why did they do this? Life in Cuba has been difficult for people in many ways. Cubans know that some things are better in America. Elian's mother had family in Miami and she believed she could give her young son a better life there. But relations between America and Cuba are bad and it's very difficult for Cubans to go to America legally, so many try to do what Elian's mother did.



In Miami Elian was frightened after the journey. But things got better: his mother's family wanted to give him a new life in America. With a new home, clothes and toys, he was soon happy again. But Elian's father had different ideas. He was in Cuba. He had no idea about the illegal journey and he wanted his little boy back.

Elian became the subject of discussions all over the world. What was best for him? To live the good life in the USA, or to be with his father?

In the end the US government³ wanted to send Elian back to Cuba. His happy father travelled to America to collect him. But first the government had to take Elian from his mother's family. In the middle of the night men with guns

went into the house where Elian lived and took him away. Soon there were pictures of the frightened little boy in newspapers everywhere. And his mother's family? They were very sad and angry.

Elian is now back in Cuba. The sad events of 1999 and 2000 are behind him. But the problems between America and Cuba are still there. People are still dying to reach their dream of life in America.
